

HISTORY OF THE KINGDOM OF CALLAWAY SUPPER

The first annual Business Men's Banquet, a forerunner of the Kingdom of Callaway Supper, was held on January 18, 1906, at the Palace Hotel in Fulton. The gathering was restricted to male owners of Fulton business firms, who were often called on to raise funds for civic enterprises. In about 1918, it was decided to invite all of the men in the county, with the president being from Fulton one year and from the county the next year.

In 1919, the name was changed to "Kingdom of Callaway Supper". President J.H. Atkinson, in his opening remarks to 328 men, said, "The supper is not an organization, but an institution." It was at this gathering that Judge David H. Harris launched a movement to erect a new county court house to replace the original built in 1826. "Providing \$125,000 for a new court house is neither an extravagant or difficult problem," he stated.

In the early 1920's, it was decided to invite women as well as to honor a native Callawegian who had left the "Kingdom" and attained a successful career in his chosen field. By 1924, the program was moved to Pratt's Theatre due to the increased attendance.

The 1936 annual event had a limited attendance of 707, the capacity of dining room facilities of five local churches, where the meals had been served since about 1912 by the church ladies. Many more than this number attended the program at the "New Fulton Theatre." The 1937 program announced the first awarding of the McCubbin Callaway Cup. This award was presented to an individual or organization in recognition of outstanding service to the community throughout the year. During the 1940's, local cafes were added to the list of eating facilities with the Fulton High School auditorium being the scene of the 1947 program.

Sovereignty of the Kingdom of Callaway was reaffirmed at the 1961 supper with the appointment of Dr. David Horton as "ambassador and minister plenipotentiary" to the nation's capitol. Since the county became a kingdom during the Civil War, it was felt that the 100th anniversary of the war was an appropriate time—even though it was only temporary. Dr. Horton was on leave of absence from Westminster College and was in Washington, D.C. at the time.

For the first time, two native Callawegians were feted as Guests of Honor at the 1971 event. To quote one of the honored guests, Ruth Dunham Dodge, "There are a great many unfortunate people who had the misfortune to be born elsewhere." In 1973, the church women's organizations felt they could not continue to accommodate the attendance any longer, so the supper was moved to William Woods College, where it continues to be held. The first woman presided over the historical supper in 1990.

Outstanding guests of honor, speakers, and presidents throughout the years have contributed to the success of the Kingdom of Callaway Suppers, but the loyal and dedicated citizens of the county have been the most significant sustaining factor. The Kingdom of Callaway Supper is a fine example of a tradition that holds us together—that gives us a yearly opportunity to ponder the fates that have brought us to our county. Young and old alike enjoy a special kind of fellowship in honoring one who has "strayed" from the fold to find success and return to receive the plaudits of fellow Callawegians and friends.

PRESIDENT THOMAS W. "TOM" HOWARD



Thomas W. "Tom" Howard grew up working alongside his dad, brother and grandfather on the family farm near Mokane, MO. He graduated salutatorian of the South Callaway class of 1979 before pursuing a degree in agriculture. In 1983 he graduated cum laude with honors with a B.S. in Agricultural Mechanization and a B.S. in Agricultural Economics from the University of Missouri-Columbia College of Agriculture.

"It is a privilege to serve as president of this year's Kingdom Supper," he says. Currently serving as General Manager of Callaway Electric Cooperative, Tom received his start with the company in 1985 as Director of Member Services. He was previously employed as a Member Service Advisor with Three Rivers Electric Cooperative in Linn, MO.

Tom serves on the Board of Directors for the Association of Missouri Electric Cooperatives, Central Electric Power Cooperative and Associated Electric Cooperative, Inc. In addition, he also serves on The Callaway Bank Fulton Advisory Board, the Fulton Area Development Corporation, the Industrial Development Authority of Callaway County. He is a past member of the Callaway County Tourism Committee.

Tom is a lifelong member of the Mokane United Methodist Church, and an active member and Past Master of the Mokane Masonic Lodge #612.

He is active in agriculture and runs a small farming operation in the Mokane community where he lives with his wife, Erin (Rogers) and their daughter, Taylor. He is the son of William E. "Bill" and Velma Howard. His father was the president of the 1978 Supper. Erin is the daughter of Buddy Joe and Patsy Rogers, also of the Mokane area.

GUEST OF HONOR RANDALL L. "RANDY" DEWS

"I am honored to be chosen as Guest of Honor of the Kingdom Supper. Growing up, I remember reading of the individuals chosen and their accomplishments, but I never dreamed that I would be deemed worthy of such an honor," says Randall L. "Randy" Dews. Born and raised near Mokane and Fulton, Randy is the son of Bonnie and the late Clark Dews.

A 1987 graduate of South Callaway High School, Randy attended the University of Missouri – Rolla until 1988 when he transferred to the University of Missouri – Columbia in an effort to be closer to family following the death of his father. He graduated magna cum laude in 1992 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Mechanical Engineering. While attending Mizzou, he worked as a co-op engineering student at the Callaway Nuclear Plant from 1990-1991.

A professional engineer with Experitec, Inc., Lenexa, KS, Randy serves as inside Sales Engineer/Project Manager responsible for control valves and turbine bypass systems for the large engineering contractors in the Kansas City area. He is responsible for oil refinery projects in western Kansas and engineering contractors in the St. Louis area.



He previously was employed with Black & Veatch's Power Division, Overland Park, KS as a mechanical system design engineer on the 500 MW sister combined cycle power plants of Muara Karang and Tambak Lorok in Indonesia, the 500 MW Melaka power project in Malaysia, the 1,230 MW Paiton coal fired power plant in Indonesia, and the 514 MW Coco Phase III hybrid coal/natural gas plant in Thailand. He also served as the Lead Piping Engineer to the Cogen South Project in Charleston, SC and one of the Lead System Design Engineers for the Nova Cogeneration Project in Red Deer, Alberta, Canada. In 1999, he was the Lead Design Engineer/Assistant Project Mechanical Engineer for the Sunrise project in Bakersfield, California. The prestigious President's Award presented by Experitec, Inc. was awarded him in 2000, 2001, 2003, and 2007. In 2004, he received the Emerson Worldwide Sales Excellence Award.

Randy has been associated with the American Cancer Society Relay for Life while in Kansas City and has served as Experitec relay team captain. He also commits his time to the school PTO.

He resides in Lincoln, Nebraska, with his wife Dr. Heather (Vahle) Dews and their two children, Kylie (7), and Connor (2).
